The Family Life Ministry Pastor will be responsible for developing and executing a Ministry Program that will contribute to the spiritual growth of our church and will include, but not be limited to, the execution and hands-on involvement in the following programs:

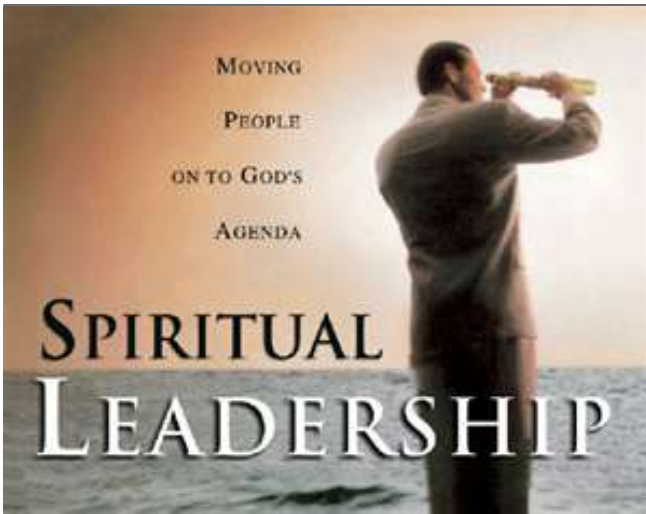

Can You Hear Him Now?

Verizon Wireless created one of the most memorable marketing campaigns ever in 2005. In their commercials a so-called "test man," accompanied by a crowd of network engineers, travels the country asking the simple question, "Can you hear me now?" in an ongoing exercise to determine the reliability of the mobile phone carrier's network.

The "catch phrase" caught on. The company's market share went up and employee turnover went down. It seemed people could relate to the struggle to connect. Folks were tired of dropped calls and unreliable communication systems. And Verizon sent a message that they wanted desperately to connect with its subscribers and wanted its subscribers to be able to connect with each other.

At the risk of selling Him short, God has done the same. Even when the Kingdom had split in two, He kept sending His message. He gave the people of the Divided Kingdom some 208 years to decide whether they would "accept" or "reject" His call. He sent His own "technicians" to get the message out. We call them "prophets."

The job of the Verizon technician is unique. But not nearly as unique as the task given Hosea. Hosea, himself a prophet, appeared in a down time in the nation of Israel. The reality is that people often hear best when things are at their worst. So Hosea signed on with God. But God gave him a most unusual assignment. Hosea's life would be his message. He was to marry a prostitute named Gomer and love her. What an incredible request! (Just imagine a young man with a seminary degree in hand trying to explain that one to a pastor search committee.)

The tough assignment was made even more difficult as Gomer left Hosea. She would conduct her 'transactions' with customers and all the time in her mind believing they were the ones supporting her. In reality, though, it was Hosea who continued to care for her and provide for her necessities even during her times of unfaithfulness.

God tells Hosea to go and demonstrate his love for her, so he does. Now picture this scene, as ugly as it is: Hosea pays some Hebrew "pimp" for some time with his wife, Gomer. When she enters the room expecting her next customer, she comes face-to-face with her husband. It is then that Hosea tells her again he loves her and wants her to come back home.

It's the lived-out message that Hosea later gives in words. And it's the same message God sends today. He loves us—even in our extreme unfaithfulness. And he wants us to come back home, even though we have abandoned him. But much like a call on your cell phone, you can hit the "accept" button or the "reject" button. You have the power to send God to voicemail and make him wait. Or you can answer his call today. The people of Israel had 208 years to pick up and they never did. The network is clear. The message is reliable. Can you hear Him now?

January 17, 2012 Minutes

Mark Deitz opened in prayer followed by a devotion by Pastor John reminding of the Great Commission Jesus gave in Matthew 28:19-20—**Make disciples—We need to help people know God, not just know about Him.**

Our Mission verbs: Love, Connect, Equip, Share!

Worship Ministry Report—The community Christmas cantata was very well received, and plans are in the works for the choirs and musicians of the community to come together again for an Easter cantata. Rehearsals begin January 22.

We are continuing special 10 a.m. Sunday Services in January with a Revival January 21-22, and a “Camp Meeting” flavored service on January 29 with members of the Lighthouse Apostolic Church meeting with us, Pastor Mike Hall and Pastor John will both share messages, and the service will be followed with a 5th Sunday Dinner on the grounds. (LEC)

Children’s Ministry - Sunday School attendance has been down. 9:00 a.m. Sunday School may be a factor. Kingdom Kids is consistent—could use more volunteer help.

Missions — Sandy Stitt shared she appreciated the support for missions. New Harvest, the Ministerial Association, and others helped buy gifts for Christmas at Palm Terrace. The offering

from the community Thanksgiving service was designated for this as well. Missions has dinners every third Wednesday to help give extra support for missionaries. The dinner on January 18 will benefit the Noahs. February 15 will be a fish fry to benefit HOOI. Pastor John is now a board member of HOOI, and went on the Christmas Trip with them to the Dominican Republic.

Membership Nurture and Care— Marci Propes reported that we have had a number of served meals with the funerals we experienced this last month. Much appreciation was extended to those who helped coordinate and brought food for those dinners.

Youth— *Dave Sankey reported that there have* Some outside kids who have been disruptive, and that 1-2 kids have been asked not to come back to youth group because they would not abide by the rules or respect the leaders. Rules and respect are vital, and they have learned there are consequences to behavior and attitude problems. Dave is focusing on our church’s kids and those who come to church to build a solid foundation and youth leadership.

Staff Parish—Carol Griggs reported that we have had several interviews for the Family Life Minister position (see front page of this month’s Powerlines). Staff Parish will meet on January 23 for a Skype interview and conference call with other potential candidates. We have a ball park salary figure in the low \$20,000 with housing and utilities provided. We are also looking into the need of possibly providing some sort of health insurance. If a person with a family is hired, then plans are for them to live in the 3 bedroom 2 bath house we acquired 3 years ago in the Invest in the

Future campaign. Alice and Herb would move into the 344 Arcade House.
 Staff Parish has reviewed the top forty-two applicants of the 150 + applications we received, and has narrowed down to less than a handful. We are still in the early stages of our search and don't want to rush. We are looking for the right person for our ministry needs, and if we don't find that person in this round, then we will continue the search.

Staff Parish is hosting a Pastor Appreciation dinner at the Family Night Dinner on Wednesday, February 29.

Finance— Mitch Thomas shared that we were blessed with a good offering in December, and that we were able to pay all our benevolences and 10 certificates. We have a balance of a little over \$2,000 in our account. Some December program and ministry expenses were paid in January and will appear in the January report.

Discussion was had about the way transfers are handled in the monthly financial report. Finance will explore alternatives.

Trustees— Met on January 9. The status of van use is still be discussed. The Conference prefers churches not use 15 passenger vans. John Well-slager has a call in to the Conference office to discuss the issue, and to see if there might be any flexibility. In the mean time, we have parked the van and it is not currently being used. The projector in the LEC will be installed as soon as mounting parts are received.

Alice has requested a signal bell be put on the front door of the office to signal when people come in so she can respond if she is in the back room making copies.

The flat roof over the food pantry area still leaks. Ardis shared that the fascia board on the Sanctuary is rotting. The sprinkler system may need to be checked and reset. Lenny Forrester will replace John Drake as a Trustee, and has done work on the Youth Minister's laundry room.

Nominations — Filling out the vacancies; Bobby Pearce agreed to serve as Ad Council Vice-chair, Lenny Forrester agreed to complete John Drakes' term as Trustee. The Ad Council voted to approve these nominations.

Pastor's Report—Pastor John shared that He will be forming a Spiritual Leadership Team in our church with people who will commit to meet and pray for our church and God's ministry in it. The Ad Council is all invited to be a part. The goal is to increase spiritual growth in our church and create environments that will produce fruit and nurture ministry. A District Leadership Training event will be held on January 28 at Grace UMC in Cape Coral.

Mark expressed appreciation for the turn-out and for everyone's service. We closed in Prayer.

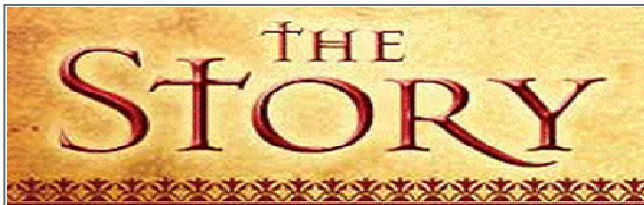

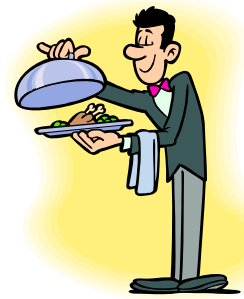
Now, a little over three years later, the house is white and we only have 37 \$1,000 certificates left to pay off. God is good!
